These shows are about gaining experience and having fun with other horse owners and riders.

PLEASE REVIEW THE RULES FOR GEAHC SHOWS:

1. ****NOTE** WALK/JOG CLASS #26 Horse and rider combination entries CANNOT ENTER ANY CLASS THAT OFFERS LOPING OR CANTERING.**
2. **LEADLINE** classes are for young riders, 6 yrs and under, incapable of riding on their own.
3. A horse entered in the **'In Hand Trail Class'** cannot be ridden in any other trail classes.
4. Attire should be appropriate for the class you are entering.
5. Grooming of horse and presentation of rider is important.
6. Please be prompt to your class.
7. 12 and Under classes are all walk/trot.
8. Colts or Stallions are allowed, however any stallion or colt that is not well mannered will not be allowed to show or be on grounds per management's discretion.
9. All horses entered in any class must be well mannered or will be excused from the arena and/or show grounds per management's discretion.
10. Good sportsmanship is required to participate.
 - a. Anyone displaying unsportsmanlike conduct in or out of the arena will be told to leave.
11. Judges decisions are final.
 - a. You may ask a judge how to improve your placement for the next show or why you placed as you did but do not criticize a judges decision.
 - b. All Appaloosa Horses competing for the High Point Appaloosa Award must exhibit obvious appaloosa color/and or characteristics (per ApHC registration rules) or present ApHC or POA registration papers at check In.
12. **YEARLING LUNGE LINE-** This class is to reward: (1) Movement, (2) Manners/Expression/Attitude, and (3) Conformation. This class should define what it means to be a "pleasure prospect" or "hunt seat prospect". Score is based on 80 points for Movement, 10 points Manners/Expression/Attitude, 20 points Conformation and 3 points Use Of Circle with a total possible score of 113 points. The horses are not expected to demonstrate behavior beyond that necessary for a reasonable presentation to the judge. Bucking and playing on the lunge line is not to be penalized
13. **THE HERITAGE (COSTUME) CLASS-** Participant in the Heritage Costume Class will be judged on authenticity of attire and verbal presentation as per horse or breed specific—the overall picture including the exhibitor's is to be considered.
 - A. A prepared narration of the costume by the exhibitor will be read by the announcer and is limited to no more than 90 seconds.
 - B. This class is to vividly portray some part of the entry's specific breed history. The Heritage class may depict the various stages of each breeds history such as Chinese emperors, kings, nobles, Spanish conquistadores, fur trappers, buffalo hunters, missionaries, etc.
 - C. There shall be only one exhibitor and one horse allowed per entry. Exhibitors will not be permitted to use a travois in the Heritage class for safety reasons.

- E. The class shall be worked at a walk and jog only, on the rail, both directions of the ring. The judge will then go through the line evaluating each entry and judging authenticity of the entries.
- I. Prohibited Appointments: Travois, hackamore bits, mechanical hackamores. Use of prohibited appointments is cause for disqualification of the entry from the class.

14. REINING CLASSES

- A. No horse may be entered in both Open and hackamore/snaffle bit reining classes at the same show.
 - B. Open Reining class horse must be shown with bit.
 - C. Hackamore or snaffle bit – Open to horses five years old and younger shown with an acceptable hackamore or snaffle bit working in the same manner as prescribed for bridled horses, except must be shown two-handed. No cross entry will be allowed between Hackamore/Snaffle Bit Reining and Open Reining at the same show.
15. If participants are signed up for the day fee, they still need to enter classes three classes prior for participation in each class. The same applies to scratches. Scratched must be done three classes prior to avoid charges.

17. WESTERN RIDING

- A. Western Riding is an event where the horse is judged on quality of gaits, lead changes at the lope, response to the rider, manners, and disposition. The horse should perform with reasonable speed, and be sensible, well-mannered, free and easy moving.
- B. Credit shall be given for an emphasis placed on smoothness, even cadence of gaits (i.e., starting and finishing the pattern with the same cadence), and the horses ability to change lead precisely, easily, and simultaneously both hind and front at the center point between markers. The horse should have a relaxed head carriage showing response to the riders hands, with a moderate flexion at the poll. Horses may be ridden with light contact or on reasonably loose rein. The horse should cross the log both at the jog and the lope without breaking gait or radically changing stride.
- C. Scoring will be on a basis of 0 to 100, with 70 denoting an average performance.
- D. An exhibitor will be penalized:
 - 1. Five (5) points
 - a. Failure to change leads (including cross-cantering)
(Note: failures to change, including cross-cantering, at two consecutive change areas would result in 10 penalty points.)
 - b. Blatant disobedience such as kicking out, biting, bucking, rearing
 - c. Use of free hand to instill fear or praise.
 - 2. Three (3) points
 - a. Not performing the specific gait (jog or lope) or not stopping when called for in the pattern, within 10 feet (3.05 m) of the designated area
 - b. Breaking gait at lope
 - c. Simple lead change
 - d. Out of lead prior to the designated change from the cone to the previous change area or out of lead after the designated change from the cone to the next designated change area.
 - e. Additional lead changes anywhere in pattern (except when correcting an extra change or incorrect lead).
 - f. In patterns one and three, failure to start the lope within 30 feet (9.15 m) after crossing the log at the jog.
 - g. Break of gait at walk or jog for two or more strides.
 - 3. One (1) point:
 - a. Break of gait at walk or jog up to two strides.

- b. Hitting or rolling log.
- c. Out of lead for more than one stride to the cone.
- d. Splitting the log (log between the two front or two hind feet) at a lope.
- 4. One half (1/2) point:
 - a. Tick or light touch of log.
 - b. Hind legs skipping or coming together during lead change.
 - c. Out of lead from 1/2 to 1 stride.
- 5. Disqualified - 0 score (cannot place)
 - a. Fall to ground by horse or exhibitor.
 - b. Illegal equipment.
 - c. Willful abuse.
 - d. Off course - which includes an incomplete pattern, incorrect order of maneuvers or passing on wrong side of marker.
 - e. Knocking over markers.
 - f. Completely missing log.
 - g. Major refusal - stop and back 2 strides or 4 steps with front legs.
 - h. Major disobedience or schooling.
 - i. Failure to start lope prior to end cone in pattern #1.
 - j. Performance of four (4) or more simple lead changes and/or failures to change leads.
 - k. Overturns of more than 1/4 turn.
- 6. The following characteristics are considered as faults and should be judged accordingly:
 - a. Opening mouth excessively or raising head on maneuvers.
 - b. Anticipating signals or early lead changes.
 - c. Stumbling.
 - d. Losing stirrup or holding on.
 - e. Any unnecessary aid given by the exhibitor, such as; unnecessary talking, petting, spurring, quirting or jerking of the reins.
- 7. Credits:
 - a. Change of leads, hind and front simultaneously.
 - b. Changes at designated point.
 - c. Accurate and smooth pattern.
 - d. Even pace throughout.
 - e. Easy to guide and control with rein and leg.
 - f. Manners and disposition.
 - g. Conformation and fitness.
